I was celebrating Black Press Week in the nation's capital, with the National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) last week.

What an exciting time. It was on March 16, 1827 when the first issue of Freedom's Journal was published — the first African American owned and operated newspaper in this country. The owners were John Brown Russworm and Samuel Cornish.

On the front page, the following state-

ment appeared:

"We wish to plead our own cause. Too long have others spoken for us."

Which brings me to my truth.

There are some serious truths about the so-called mainstream press.

If you hear people complaining about inequities or racist coverage in 2024, imagine how it was 197 years ago.

The Black Press had a noble beginning and there were valiant men and women who sacrificed everything to provide Black people with a voice.

I can't help but believe that if they were here today; they would be disappointed that percentage-wise fewer Black people are supportive of the institution they lived, fought and died for.

So as I gathered with other publishers from across the country my heart was full with pride. These soldiers without swords were carrying the torch. They were speaking up and speaking out.

What can I say? I tried to imagine the challenges over the decades, as we march toward 200 years of the Black Press.



Service with a smile.

The love I feel for the Black Press is so strong, because I so deeply believe in what I am doing; telling the stories of our people from the rooter to the tooter (essentially the beginning to the ending). There was a time when the Black Press covered Black people from the time they were born until they died.

That meant you got to hear about the birth, going to school, events they participated in, graduations, church programs, society programs and organizations, employment, and more.

Someone went off to college, and they graduated, and some were drafted into the military. We read about all of that.

There were the engagements, marriages, baby showers, and anniversaries.

We read about those returning home from the military; and sadly we learned of the death of those who didn't come home.

Still further, the Black Press informed about promotions, and job retirements.

It was especially nice to read about those wonderful family reunions. And then, we also learned through our Black Press, about the deaths.

It was so different from what we read about in other publications.

That's probably why more than 150 years after the birth of the Black Press, the Dallas-Fort Worth Association of Black Communicators, under the leadership of the group that was affectionately called the "Dallas Mafia," began holding community forums — "How to get in the news without committing murder!"

It seemed the only way Blacks were covered in the mainstream, for the most part, was if they committed a crime

So every year we come together and we celebrate the founding of the Black Press, and we celebrate the courageous men and women who made sure that today we could look back, and read about the rich history of Black people in America in our Black newspapers.

Now back to Kitchen+Kocktails.

When NNPA was not taking care of business, we had to eat. Folks suggested places. I remembered that while they originated in Dallas, TX, they had a restaurant in Washington DC, so I suggested it to fellow publishers.

I knew it was a stretch, because this place is very popular, and for good reason.

I didn't know if we'd be able to get in so I called a former coworker from our days at Paul Quinn college, who happens to be the mom of Kevin Kelley; the owner of the restaurant. And I called his sister Deanna who, like her brother, was in Sen. Royce West's Dr. Emmett J. Conrad Leadership Program and did the equivalent of throwing a hat in the air.

I was so pleased with Kitchen+Kocktails.

From the time we walked in, they treated us special, but guess what they treated everybody special and that was so heartwarming.

The staff was on point. The food was great.

When they said "catfish" they served great catfish, not Swai! Our crew really liked the black-eyed peas, lamb chops, and everything placed before them!

Lo and behold later that night I get a call because he wants his bread pudding.

I told him it was Black history!

Two days later we returned. One of the publishers, Brian Townsend talked about how he enjoyed the experience and I was just beaming inside. They found the price to be affordable, the food to be wonderful and they really enjoyed themselves, especially when the chef came to greet us!

In 1827 you didn't have a choice, you had to eat Black, but you have one in 2024 and if it was good for you then why is it not good for you today?

To the entire Kitchen+Kocktails family, I get choked up even writing about the experience because I am so proud of you all.

Back at the hotel we told the concierge about our experience and how reasonable the meal was for the portions and taste.

NNPA President and CEO, Dr. Ben Chavis, with three other members of our group also enjoyed Kitchen+Kocktails.

It was wonderful!

As we go about our lives, we need to understand we need the Black Press and we need Black businesses, like Kitchen+Kocktails.

Please search deep, down deep, and make a commitment to support those who are committed to supporting us!

After all, you shouldn't ask people to do for you what you won't do!

Kitchen+Kocktails completed their assignment with flying colors! Our ancestors would be proud, like I am!





Y'all better Quit Playin'! Not even Joel Osteen can find a joke for this crowd!



For the third consecutive year, Witherite Law Group and 1-800-TruckWreck are partnering with Dallas radio station K104-FM to feed approximately 500 Dallas-Fort Worth-area families. Millions of Americans struggle with food insecurity, and North Texas has the fourth-highest number of food-insecure people nationwide with over 630,000 facing hunger. Witherite Law Group and 1-800-Truck-Wreck are directly addressing this challenge by providing the wherewithal for local families to have a plentiful meal this Easter.

"Hunger impacts people year-round, and we're working to ease the burden during a holiday revered by many. We want our neighbors to enjoy coveted time with family without worrying about how or if they will have a decent meal," said Amy Witherite, founder of Witherite Law Group and 1-800-TruckWreck. "Our goal is to meet the needs of the most vulnerable in our community, giving them something money cannot buy: peace of mind and time with loved ones on a day that represents hope and faith."

Over 95 countries around the globe celebrate Easter with varying traditions; family time and meals are a staple for most. In the U.S., Easter dinner traditionally consists of glazed ham, various side dishes and desserts. However, one in eight North Texas residents do not have



When I was a child, my mom would always warn me about blowing up bridges that I may need to cross later. I didn't quite understand what she meant but as an adult, I get it. In a nutshell, these quotes were life lessons, they are nuggets of wisdom. I interpret this one to mean that if you treat relationships poorly, you may need them later and can't go back.

Some bridges are not meant to be utilized. If you decide to take a route you were never supposed to take, it's not fair to leave damage behind either. You made a decision that didn't work for you but you've now made it difficult for the next person who may need that route to their destiny. The next person is suffering the consequences of a bad decision made by someone else.

Some bridges may not be a part of your journey now because you may believe they can not support you. You believe you deserve to take a much more established route. Yet, as that bridge is fortified, it becomes stronger and sturdier. There will come a time when you may need that support and the bridge has become a thoroughfare for others but has no room for you.

Relationships are a form of currency. So many people are not mindful of how relationships are like a bank account. You must make deposits by the way you care for and grow relationships. It's work. Whales Are Dying and the Fossil Fuel Industry is Lying



Whoever would have thought fossil fuel industry front groups would make whales and other marine species a cultural wedge issue? However, thanks to a deception campaign targeting wind energy that's exactly where we find ourselves.

The Marine Mammal Stranding Center in New Jersey rescues and rehabilitates live beached animals and performs necropsies on the remains of dead ones to pinpoint their causes of death. Sheila Dean, one of the group's founders, describes how the rampant misinformation connecting whale deaths to sonar used in surveying the seafloor for offshore wind farms is making her job more difficult. And it is distracting people from what is really killing the whales: vessel strikes, climate change, plastic pollution, and entanglement in fishing gear and marine debris.

"I've been doing this for 47 years. We had a lot of whale deaths in 2023 but there have been years we've had more. In 2013 we had a lot of whales and dolphins washing up. Our necropsy data show a wide variety of possible causes of death, including blunt force trauma from suspected vessel strikes. If the sonar from mapping was killing marine life, our shores likely would have been littered with hundreds, if not thousands of dead and dying marine mammals."

The frenzy that has been whipped up against offshore wind energy has thrust Dean's organization into the storm. Anti-wind activists and the people they have duped are demanding close examination of whale's ears to show signs of damage from sonar. But most beached whale remains are in an advanced state of decomposition, making that impossible. Where there have been beached animals that have not been too decomposed, mostly dolphins, the MMSC and its partners have gone the extra mile and incurred great cost for CT scans and lab analysis. The results? No evidence of auditory trauma.

Scientists have been clear. Disruptions in the whales' feeding patterns, water salinity, and currents are likely the result of climate change. Dean points out the whales are following their food source, which is what brings them into the shipping lanes.

Finding no evidence that sonar mapping for offshore wind farms is connected to the whale deaths, groups like Dean's are being targeted as if they are part of some cover up fueled by the wind industry. Dean is clear that her organization takes no money from the wind industry.

Meanwhile, the real problems behind the increase in whale deaths go unaddressed. And with climate change perhaps the largest overriding problem, and our transition away from fossil fuels to clean energy the solution... well, it is not hard to see how this is by design.

Lies and deceit have always been the stock-in-trade of the fossil fuel industry's public relations and lobbying efforts. Back in 2009 when I was national president of the NAACP, the lobbying firm for a major coal industry group faked a letter to Congress from our Albemarle-Charlottesville chapter in Virginia to stop a climate bill. The letter even used NAACP letterhead and declared opposition to the American Clean Energy and Security Act, a bill we actually supported!

So let us follow the money behind the rising tide of local front groups opposing offshore wind development. The organizing efforts and litigation come from organizations with benign names like the

American Coalition for Ocean Protection and Save Right Whales.

Those organizations link back to dark

money groups like the Texas Public Policy Foundation, the Caesar Rodney Institute, and the Committee for a Constructive Tomorrow. And those groups are funded by fossil fuel interests like Exxon-Mobil and the Charles Koch Foundation. Major players include operatives who have been on the forefront of climate denial for years and involved in previous political smear jobs like the Swiftboat Veterans for Truth.

These groups opposing wind energy are not just screaming their lies into the wind. They are shifting public opinion. A Monmouth poll shows public support for New Jersey's offshore wind projects has dropped from 76 percent to 54 percent in the wake of the disinformation campaign around whale deaths.

The Northeast as a region has been among the most forward-thinking when it comes to the use and development of renewable energy. If these groups are successful in blocking the development of renewable energy adoption and production in the Northeast, it does not bode well for the rest of the country. And the fossil fuel industry knows it.

We are already seeing Big Oil and Gas target solar with blatant misinformation targeted at communities across the country. A recent NPR report detailed how one group connected to polluters and climate deniers, the so-called Citizens for Responsible Solar, "has helped local groups fighting solar projects in at least 10 states including Ohio, Kentucky and Pennsylvania."

So, if it has not already, misleading campaigns of the fossil fuel industry could be coming to a town near you. Remember if you see a group opposing clean energy, it is usually a good idea to follow the money behind the message.



Under the Biden-Harris Save Plan \$138 Billion Loan Debt Canceled





SCOTUS Upholds Racist Texas Anti-Immigration Law SB 4

AUSTIN, Texas – The U.S. Supreme Court has yet again overturned precedent and upheld Texas' anti-immigration bill SB 4 – which has been under scrutiny by the DOJ and immigrant rights advocates since Texas Governor Greg Abbott signed it into law last December.

SB 4 adds improper border entry as a new criminal offense that would place tens of thousands of undocumented Texas residents and migrants in the state criminal justice system. SB 4 will empower the Texas judicial system to deport vulnerable migrants whose only crime is seeking a better life for their families and the American Dream.


Texas Democratic Party Chair Gilberto Hinojosa issued the following statement:

"Let me be unequivocally clear: MAGA Republicans' SB 4 isn't about community safety – it's about enabling DPS to target neighborhoods and imprison people for the sake of Fox News headlines. This inhumane border strategy will now force American citizens to carry passports in their own neighborhoods and enforce mass deportations of migrant women and children – all while overburdening local law enforcement.

"Right now, Texas Democrats from Austin to Washington are laser-focused on tackling southern border security with evidence-based solutions like the Bipartisan Security Bill and forming a Border Task Force in Congress. The MAGA Republican strategy to turn our southern border communities into a political battleground is cruel, shortsighted and divisive – undermining the very fabric of our country's fundamental freedoms."

State Senator Royce West (D-Dallas), also shared his response to the Supreme Court's decision.

Without question, this legislation carries with it the ability to codify racial profiling by giving law enforcement the pro-





verbial green light to target with impunity, anyone who in their opinion, looks illegal.

SB 4 gives law enforcement the power to arrest a person if they suspect that person is an undocumented immigrant. I ask what are the factors that could amount to reasonable suspicion? Could it be the color of a person's skin, the language they speak, or the communities where they live or are passing through?

During debate on this bill before the Senate during the fourth special session of the legislature last year, there was robust discussion on what would constitute probable cause to allow an arrest under SB 4. The truth is that what constitutes probable cause is up to each and every individual law enforcement officer in the State of Texas at the time they engage in a traffic stop or other police and citizen interaction.

Let me be clear, SB 4 does NOT provide a mechanism for police to determine reasonable suspicion regarding who is and or who is not here legally. In fact, the majority of those voting in favor of this law voted against clarifying how police could determine probable cause or reasonable suspicion regarding enforcement of this now-enacted law!

Questions remain at every judicial level as to whether SB 4 stands in violation of 14th Amendment equal protection provisions. And of even more glaring constitutional concern is that SB 4 is in direct conflict with the federal government's jurisdiction over immigration enforcement, consistent with the Supreme Court's 2012 ruling in Arizona v. United States.

Because this law does not prescribe probable cause or reasonable suspicion for arresting or detaining an individual, persons in this state can be subject to disparate and different policies and practices regarding who is legally allowed to be here. Enforcement activities may vary by area, from urban, to rural, to the border region.

No one deserves to be treated differently by officers simply because of the color of their skin. Senate Bill 4 sets the stage for law enforcement to unduly view those who are brown through a lens of suspicion.

Texas needs real solutions to address the problems at our southern border, and Senate Bill 4 creates nothing more than a pathway to confusion that could result in the arrest and detention of innocent Texans.

What Dallas' \$1.25 billion bond program covers Early voting starts April 22 for the May 4 election. The city hasn't yet released a final list of projects planned to be paid for with the bond money.

Almost a month before Dallas voters can begin casting early ballots for or against a \$1.25 billion bond program, they still don't have a final list of projects the bond money could cover.

Dallas city officials had said they planned to make the full project list available by the end of February. But it remains unknown when the itemized list of streets, parks, housing projects and other infrastructure upgrades will be made public. Early voting is April 22-30, and election day is May 4.

Jennifer Nicewander, director of the city's bond and construction management office, and Robert Perez. an assistant city manager who oversees the bond office and other city infrastructure and transportation-related departments, didn't respond to requests for comment Monday about when the list would be public. Perez told the City Council in February that the goal was to have the list finalized by the end of that month.

City officials had planned to host town hall meetings to educate voters about the bond plans ahead of the election, but they have scrapped those plans.

In a March 8 memo to the City Council, Perez said the city-sanctioned meetings were being canceled after hearing from the city attorney's office. The office did not order that the meetings to be canceled, but said state law prohibits public money from being used for political advertising or for communications that could likely influence a voter's decision.

"Any informational townhall meetings would be restricted to the ballot language, proposition description, proposition amount and the payback tial measure, are impermissible, our office cautions against any use of public resources at any time to advocate on behalf of or in opposition to an item that could become a measure on an upcoming ballot," Palomino's memo said.

amount for that proposition with no reference to individual projects," Perez's memo said. "As a result of the project listing discussion restriction, the informational town halls for the 2024 bond program have been cancelled."

City Attorney Tammy Palomino explained in a Feb. 14 memo to the City Council and other officials that state law bans public resources from being used to advocate for the passage or failure of a ballot measure. She said the law was not intended to prevent city councils from discussing whether to place a bond measure on the ballot, but does not make clear what other types of uses are allowed beyond that.

"And, because the election code is silent as to when use of public resources to advocate on behalf of a measure, or a poten-

The brunt of educating voters about the \$1.25 billion bond program could fall to a privately-funded campaign launched in support of the propositions. A political action committee called 2024 Dallas Bond Campaign has registered with the Texas Ethics Commission but has not yet reported details about its funding or donors.

Attorney Tim Powers, a former chair of the city's ethics advisory commission who now co-chairs the bond campaign, said the group is planning a public outreach effort that will include mailers, social media posts, yard signage and a website. He said he believes the group will have a "broad coalition of supporters," will aim to raise about \$1 million for the campaign and has raised about half that amount.

"We have a very narrow win-

dow of time, but we think we have an appropriate window of time to get the message out that we need to get out," Powers said. "We're not aware that there's any organized opposition. But we hope we're clear enough with what we're able to communicate to convince everybody to support this for the long-term best interest of Dallas."


Dallas voters will be asked to approve 10 propositions in the election that would allow the city to borrow a total of \$1.25 billion for improvements to roads, parks and libraries, as well as other projects focused on housing infrastructure, homelessness, public safety and cultural arts facilities, flood protection and storm draining, economic development and city information technology.

The biggest chunk of bond money, more than \$521 million, will go to street- and transportation-related projects, followed by almost \$346 million for park and recreation projects and \$90 million for police and fire facilities.


Powers said he believed the full project list will be available by next week. He said the campaign is working with several civic organizations and has the endorsements of Mayor Eric Johnson and four past mayors: Mike Rawlings, Tom Leppert, Laura Miller and Ron Kirk.

An Opportunity to Stop the Hate: Lent and Ramadan



We, the citizens of the United States of America, as well as our fellow citizens of the world, are living in a period of unprecedented conflict. While the word "hatred" is rarely used or mentioned, it is the source of the worst among us toward others. In this country, founded upon the melting pot idea that there is room for everyone, we find people continuing to be attacked based on their race, color, religion, nationality and appearance. It is timely that two of the world's greatest religions would intersect this month with a shared idea that for ages has been the solution to hate and its destruction.

The Christian observance of Lent and the Muslim observance of Ramadan are intersecting with a shared religious practice known as "fasting". The Christian observance calls for giving up certain foods or practices for a 40 day period as a symbolic sharing with Christ in his suffering. Lent is calculated based on the spring equinox.

Ramadan falls on the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, which follows a lunar cycle. As a result, the dates for Ramadan change every year, and the period of fasting is for one month. Muslims fast from dawn until sunset for the entire month. The fast is broken each evening with a meal called "iftar". Fasting is one of the five Pillars of Islam, which are the foundations of Muslim life. Christian fasting in contrast, as established by the Catholic Church, leads up to Easter which celebrates the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ.

The importance of this discussion rests with the fact that the concept of fasting in both religions is to bring one closer to God. For the Christian, prayer and self denial during this period seeks to draw one closer to God by reflecting on one's life and conduct in regards to others. Muslims believe that Ramadan is a time of heightened spirituality during which they can purify their souls and seek forgiveness for their sins.

It sounds like this is a good time for all of America to engage in some prayer and fasting for a nation at odds with itself and for a people engaged in hatred and violence against others. What greater way to stop the hate than through prayer and fasting, regardless as to whether one is Christian or Muslim or any other faith. The concept of fasting with both religions appears to be in line with the scripture from the Bible in 2 Chronicles 7:14

We as a nation have an opportunity during this period to set in motion the healing we all so desperately need. Prayer and Fasting have changed the course of individuals, people and nations and it is not too late for us. Let's get about the business of Stopping The Hate.

Six years after Dallas approved monument to racial violence victims, it's finally happened

Next to downtown's Grassy Knoll, new public artwork provides another vital history lesson about our city's ugly past.

Adjacent to the Sixth Floor Museum and the Grassy Knoll sits another patch of sacred ground with its own historically consequential story.

It took Dallas decades to fully face President John F. Kennedy's assassination. It's taken far longer to acknowledge the murders that occurred about 100 years earlier — just on the other side of where the Triple Underpass would eventually stand.

In 1860, three enslaved Black men — Patrick Jenkins, Cato Miller and the Rev. Samuel Smith — were lynched at this site, alongside the original path of the Trinity River. They were hanged after specious accusations concerning their part in setting a downtown fire, and their deaths became part of an infamous reign of terror led by white businessmen during which enslaved individuals were rounded up and tortured.

At long last, Dallas will formally dedicate a sculp-

ture on the site next Tuesday that honors these three men and all other local victims of lynching and racial violence between 1853 and 1920.

"Shadow Lines," the sundial-inspired weathering steel sculpture, is the work of artists Shane Allbritton and Norman Lee. At one end of its semicircular wall is a poem written by former Dallas resident and poet laureate of Virginia Tim Seibles about this spot and its brutal history.

In early 2018, in the midst of the debate over removal of Confederate statues, City Council members expressed interest in a memorial to victims of racial violence. George Keaton Jr., founder of Remembering Black Dallas, persevered until his death in December 2022 to turn the idea into action. The Dallas County Justice Initiative, with Ed Gray at the helm, and Remembering Black Dallas finished the job.

The sculpture sits in a pocket of city land known as Martyrs Park. It's not an ide-

al place for a contemplative green space, trapped between the Triple Underpass and the access ramp to Interstate 35E and deafened by highway traffic and the Trinity Railway Express rumbling overhead.

It's no mystery why the dedication ceremony is taking place at the Sixth Floor Museum before the ribbon-cutting at the sculpture site. Hearing the speeches would be impossible at Martyrs Park.

But Gray, like Keaton before him, is steadfast about this being the right location.

"To the people who ask, 'Why did we build this here?' This is where it occurred," Gray told me. "We can't change what's there now, but it remains historic and sacred."

I took my first close look at the sculpture Saturday and was pleasantly surprised to find a more welcoming feel at Martyrs Park, a raw space full of trash and tents on my several previous visits.

Accessibility remains a challenge. Your best bet is to

park in the Sixth Floor Museum area and walk along the Elm Street sidewalk and through the pedestrian tunnel. Once you emerge, you are only steps from the park.

The most important upgrades have taken place in the tunnel. Never before had I walked through this long dark corridor when it didn't smell like a urinal — and looked even worse. It's now been repaired, painted, scrubbed and lighted. On order is vandal-resistant permanent lighting.

The park department has cleaned out decades of trash, underbrush and scraggly bushes that once encircled much of Martyrs Park. The lower limbs of the stately trees along the street and in

Art Imitates Life

Hollywood is known for creating fantasies and false narratives, but the entertainment industry does keep it real sometimes, particularly in its efforts to help eliminate the stigma of mental illness. Mental health awareness for African Americans has found its way into popular TV programs with creators and showrunners including storvlines that see main characters seeking therapy or having characters be mental health providers. Other shows feature therapy in other ways.

Filmmaker and show creator Lena Waithe deserves kudos for normalizing therapy by incorporating it into series like "Twenties" and "The Chi." In a "Twenties" episode titled "Happy Place," the main character, a queer Black woman named Hattie, played by Jonica "Jojo" T. Gibbs, seeks therapy to understand her father's absence and its impact on her relationships with men. On "The Chi" after one of the show's main characters. Kiesha Williams, portrayed by actress Birgundi Baker, is abducted and becomes pregnant from the sexual assault, she is seen in multiple episodes visiting a psychologist.

She also encourages her family to work on their issues. Kiesha's mother and her wife also see a therapist throughout the series' six seasons. The main male characters also participate in a circle discussion, meant to help them support each other.

On "Queen Sugar," the lovingly protective Hollingsworth "Hollywood" Desonier, played by Omar Dorsey,

creates and funds a space for men to gather and uplift each other called The Real Spot, after being injured on an oil rig and successfully suing his employer.

Directed by Debbie Allen for most of its six seasons, "A Different World" took on a number of serious issues including apartheid and divestment, domestic violence,

date rape, and colorism. In an episode titled "Ex-Communication," its resident Southern belle, Whitley Gilbert, played by Jasmine Guy, visits a therapist to help her through relationship woes. Allen plays the exasperated therapist who helps her find clarity and tells her to "relax, relate, release," which becomes a mantra for many that is still used to this day to help center one's self and get through a tough or trying situation.

In an episode of "Living Single" titled, "Shrink to Fit," Khadijah James, played by rapper-turned actress Queen Latifah, seeks out a therapist to deal with things she's going through. The therapist, Dr. Bryce, is played by "A Different World" actress Jasmine Guy.

On the series "Crazy Ex-Girlfriend," actress Charlene "Michael" Hyatt portrays a therapist, Dr. Noelle Akopian, who provides her client with a safe space to examine her feelings and underlying problems.

On HBO's "In Treatment," award-winning actress Uzo Aduba, best known for her role as Crazy Eyes on Netflix's "Orange is the New Black," plays a doctor who offers care to patients, while battling her own demons.

MTV's Couples Retreat highlights celebrity couples. Pairs have included "Love & Hip Hop" stars Joc and Kendra Robinson, R&B singers Ronnie and Shamari DeVoe, and Raymond Santana, one of five Black teens wrongfully convicted of a violent attack in New York's Central Park in 1989, and "Flavor of Love" alum Chandra "Deelishis" Davis.

The show is hosted by actress-turned wellness and life coach, AJ Johnson and relationship coach Tony Gaskins, who call in a number of experts to offer advice to the couples.

WEtv has similar shows, "Marriage Boot Camp: Hip Hop Edition" and "Marriage Boot Camp: Hip Hop Reality Stars." Couples get relationship advice from Dr. Ish Major and Judge Lynn Toler. Past pairs have included Soulja Boy and Nia Riley, Monie Love and Tony Tuff, Mally Mall and Tresure Price. Ray J and Princess Love, and Waka Flocka Flame and Tammy Rivera.

National Links Trust Celebrates Black Golfers Screening

To celebrate Black History Month, The National Links Trust (NLT), a non-profit organization created to protect and promote municipal golf courses, showed the documentary "Uneven Fairways" on Feb. 20. The screening took place at the Rayburn House Office Building on Capitol Hill.

"The legends of Black golf have forged for inclusion at the highest levels of golf competition for all people," said Damian Cosby, executive director of NLT.

Released in 2009, Uneven Fairways is narrated by actor Samuel L. Jackson, an avid golfer whose activism and work in Black communities stretches back to being a student at Morehouse College in the 1960s.

The film highlights the pantheon of Blacks-from Pete Brown, the first Black golfer to win a PGA Tour event at the 1965 Waco Open, to Jim Thorpe, a 75-year-old golfer and Morgan State University graduate with 21 professional wins-who reflect the vanguard of Black golfers who were barred from the professional ranks but persisted in the sport until the PGA's racial barriers ceased in 1961.


Peggy White, the daughter of Ted Rhodes appeared in the documentary, too; Rhodes was widely considered to be the greatest Black golf player before Tiger Woods' emergence.

Rhodes did not get a chance to compete on the PGA Tour.

"I don't think my father was aware of the trailblazer he was," White said. "He had a dream that he would be the finest golfer in the world, but I don't think he realized he accomplished that goal."

Throughout the film, golfers detail how the PGA's color barrier was upheld by a longstanding clause in the PGA. From 1929 to 1961, Article III Section I of the PGA's handbook stated that, "Male professional golfers of the Caucasian race, over the age of eighteen (18) years, residing in North or South America, who can qualify under the terms and condition hereinafter specified, shall be eligible for membership."

While the documentary tells the story of the individual experience of being Black in golf, Uneven Fairways also highlights the founding of the United Golf Association, commonly known as the Chitlin Circuit, which provided Black golfers opportunities to compete.

"Black people, being very resourceful, wanted to play, and so in 1925, a group of Black businessmen met in a YMCA in Washington, D.C. and basically said 'Well, PGA won't let us play on their tour, so we'll start our own tour," said Pete McDaniel, author of Uneven Lines: The Heroic Story of African-Americans in Golf.

Later that year, the first National Negro Open was contested.

The Chitlin Circuit served as an incubator for many of golf's first popular Black players and served as fertile ground for future golf giants.

Speaking to the documentary's name, golfers talked about the conditions of golf courses that UGA players conducted golf tournaments on, citing shoddy landscapes and uneven grounds, usually played on municipal golf courses.

"One of the reasons why I love municipal golf is that it brings people together," Cosby said. "It's the easy way to get a young Black kid who's probably never seen as much green grass on a golf course to keep them out there. That's what I love about it; it connects people to the game and brings people to the game."

Inclusivity was no question for the UGA. Black women were automatically members of the association. Renee Powell, the second Black woman to participate in the LPGA tour, who spoke about her admission into UGA as a teenage golfer, was mentioned in the documentary.

"All the young Black golfers, that's where they played," Albert Green, a UGA/PGA player, explained. "Lee Alder, Charlie Sifford, Calvin Peete, Teddy Rhodes, that's where those guys got their start."

Ron Terry called the Chitlin Circuit a family affair, "It was a tour where you got to know everybody," he said. "It was more like a fraternity than anything."

Many mentioned how players supported one another in efforts on and off the course.

"We all traveled together anyway, so we helped each other...if you were hungry, we're going to feed you, we weren't going to let go around hungry," Leonard James explained.

Members often paid for and provided their own resources, which they were happy to share with others.


"They were going to eat because I always carried electric pots with me and a frying pan," James Black joked back.

Although an alternative league was created, it was still very clear that the color line imposed barriers that didn't impact White athletes.

"It was a joy to be around but it was separate, totally separate and not equal," said John Merchant, a former USGA executive committee member.

Though golfers made their own efforts to break the color barrier of the golf world, the documentary shed light on how Joe Louis, the former heavyweight champion broke the


